MEETING MINUTES

- 1. Approval of the meeting minutes from November 26, 2024, and February 25, 2025
 - a. November 26, 2024—Approved.
 - b. February 25, 2025—Approved.
 - c. March 25, 2025—Approved.

2. Budget Update

- a. The travel funding requests deadline was April 1, as all requisitions for 2024-25 needed to be entered by April 25. The committee was able to approve the entire list of March travelers for their full requested amounts.
- Even with every funding request approved and encumbered, approximately \$5,000 remains in the budget for last-minute requests and any other outstanding charges.
- 3. Professional Learning Trainings—Spring 2025 [Technology and Innovation]
 - a. Completed trainings
 - i. Drug Safety and Overdose Prevention

The first overdose prevention training was held on April 9, and attendees enjoyed facilitator AJ Banuelos's energetic and engaging presentation. A second training is available on May 8 at 3:00 p.m. in LH-101.

ii. Technology Fridays!

Videos for the last three trainings—"Al for Workplace Efficiency," "Remote Work Tools," and "Zoom Tools"—are available for viewing, or are in the process of being posted, on the Vision Resource Center.

iii. Gallup CliftonStrengths – Academic Team

Academic Deans and directors participated in a two-day workshop facilitated by Shanell Tyus where participants evaluated their own styles of leadership and how to nurture and cultivate their unique, personal strengths and skills within their roles.

iv. Survey Results

The committee reviewed the survey results from the various employee trainings and assessed the strengths and challenges in each. Surveys also revealed the kinds of topics that attendees are interesting in learning more about—some of the most popular topics included emergency preparedness, active shooter, CPR, online security, inclusive sex and reproductive health, and fire/safety/first aid training.

Learning opportunities can also be shared with students, particularly those who are newer to the technology and its potential as a valuable aid.

 - a. It's Poetry Month, and the library is running a "black-out" poetry activity throughout the month. They are also celebrating Neurodiversity Awareness Month with a display of books by and about neurodivergent authors and characters.
