SUPERINTENDENT/PRESIDENT REPORT

- As of Wednesday, March 5, our spring semester unduplicated headcount enrollment is at 10,828 students.
- Our faculty and staff continue to work together to identify and remove any phantom students from class rosters, to ensure that our authentic students have access to the classes they need to successfully complete their academic goals. The topic of phantom students continues to be a challenge at all community colleges throughout the state and our State Chancellor's Office is working to find effective ways to support our colleges in this area.
- I was invited to throw out a ceremonial first pitch at our women's softball game on February 20, following our annual Scholar-Baller celebration where we recognized a record 169 scholar athletes for their academic excellence.
- On March 4, I was invited to throw out a ceremonial first pitch at our men's baseball team's conference opener against Bakersfield College.
- Thank you to all faculty and staff who provided input via a campus wide survey related to our EFMP Update, as well as our branding project (a separate survey).

 - Common Course Phase 2 will be split into an A and B sections. Templates will be available late May, and faculty reconvening will begin in June regarding Phase 3.
 - There have been changes for Title Five, such as the need to document the accommodation and engaging diverse student bodies, advancing equitable student outcomes and promoting inclusion of all students.
 - ADT changes- Elementary Teacher Education will most likely have 2.0 version where the math will be optional, as math is not currently CalGETC approved.

Discussion

Student access to Canvas classes following the end of a term—Becky Rudd

The team discussed the possibility of extending the availability of Canvas classes beyond the current one-week period after the end of a term. They considered the potential benefits for students, such as access to materials for future classes. The team also discussed the importance of communicating any changes to faculty and students, with a suggestion to send

out information through the Deans. The team did not reach a final decision on the proposed changes, but agreed to gather more feedback from students and faculty before making a decision.

The group discussed the need for faculty to be trained on how to adjust the availability dates of their courses, and Canvas features in general. This could possibly serve as a Flex Day breakout session. There were concerns raised about faculty preparedness for teaching online, which led to discussions about new standards for online education and the need for more staff for online classes.
